Incense burning Instructions

Instructions for burning incense: 1. Burning with charcoal.

Be sure to use a fireproof pad, also handle the charcoal tablet above a fire-resistant ground. Fill the censer with some incense burner sand. Ideally, hold the charcoal tablet with a charcoal tong or place it on a tablespoon. The tongs can be obtained from us. Light the charcoal with a strong flame of a lighter and place it in the sand bed. Again and again help by blowing until it is completely glowing. Then allow it to cool slightly till it is covered with grayish-white ash. Sprinkle some incense burner sand as a heat protection on the charcoal and put your chosen incense on it. Enjoy and relax.

Instructions for burning incense: 2. Burning with incense burner

Place the burner on a fireproof pad, e.g. flagstone or plate. Place the stainless steel sieve on the burner and then put on your chosen incense. If you want to burn sensitive resins, e.g. resins that become very liquid, or herbs, we recommend that you put our metal disc between the sieve and the incense. In case you have very bad tea lights, it is advisable to place a small non-flammable pedestal under the tealight, e.g. an upside down empty tealight. Then light the tealight. Now you can enjoy the wonderful scent.

For cleaning, we recommend to remove the incense from the sieve after cooling and to remove residues from the sieve with a brass brush. The brass brush can also be obtained from us. Persistent residues can be removed well with cooking oil. Some customers have told us that they also occasionally put it in the dishwasher.

Safety instructions: Always use a fireproof pad for burning. Incense burners can get very hot. Therefore, do not touch it until it cools down. Never leave candles or glowing coals unattended and keep them out of the reach of children and pets. Do not throw used coal into garbage until it is completely extinguished.
